SCHEME OF ACADEMIC UPGRADATION OF SLOW LEARNER

The institution assesses the learning levels of the students, after admission and organises special programs for advanced learners and slow learners

Response:

Induction Programme and Need Assessment Activity
At the onset a week long orientation programme is organized which covers four broad dimensions:

- (a) About B.Ed Programme, its cognitive and non-cognitive inputs, programme expectations from the students
- (b) Need assessment exercise- distribution of student as per their option courses and pedagogical subjects. Students allocation to the Mentors, Tutors, Pedagogical Subject Supervisors
- (c) Exploring talent and conduct of cultural and co-curricular activities.
- (d) Add-on-Course-Identification and enrolment of students for various Add-on Courses on "Content Enrichment" and other thematic concerns.

Interventions/activities

• To assess student's pre-requisite knowledge, aptitude and skill, at entry level ,Teacher Aptitude Test is administered on every student admitted to B.Ed Programme. This test makes us understand perception, aptitude and certain competencies and skills required for the B.Ed Programme. This exercise provides a strong cues to devise teaching strategies for new batch.

- Exercise has been conducted at the commencement of the B.Ed. programme which helps the faculty members to identify students with special needs of differently abled.
- During orientation programme a rich platform is provided to the students to interact with the teachers of subjects, express themselves freely and independently, display their mental strength, and perform their talent.
- Tutorial In-charge and House In-charge help to identify the needs and skills of the students and allocate students to the Mentors
- *Talent hunt completion helps the students to show their hidden talent.*
- To check the backgrounds of the student, especially the subjects studied by them is taken into consideration while allowing them to opt for different optional papers and teaching,
- Effort is being made to identify learning gaps amongst the students, i.e there may be some students who opted pedagogical subjects and have not studied allied subjects. All those students are enrolled under "Add on Course on Content Enrichment of specific subject" As well as for thematic Add on Course.

Curriculum design is aligned with the industry (here educational institutions). Suggestions are invited from faculty regarding curriculum design and development and it is passed on to the Program coordination committee members who implement the suggestions at the College level. The College has a committee to look after the effective implementation and timely completion of prescribed syllabi in various disciplines. MENTOR/MENTEE POLICY

The College is expected to satisfy the needs of the students from diverse backgrounds including backward community as well as from different locales. The students are assessed by the faculty members for their special learning needsbased on their performance in the internal assessment examination and annual examinations. To control all these variables college has developed its mentor/mentee system to facilitate academic, social and emotional support to the students.

Every faculty member is allocated students who will act as a mentor for two years. Following are the proposed set of actions:

Advanced Learners-

For advanced learners there is **Scholar Club**comprising of scholars from each faculty of College which helps in exchange of their knowledge. Small **research projects** under the guidance of the faculty members are allotted to students to cater their need of advanced learning in the field of research and innovation. Students are also given opportunities to participate and represent department and College at various **state**, **national levelconferences and workshops** wherein they present papers, posters, participate in various competitions.

Internship program has been initiated wherein the students are made to take projects in various domains like hospital, transport, mess, hostel etcto develop the administrative and organizational skills among the students. Students are also allotted projects dealing with the problems faced in the College premises.

Slow Learners -

Adequate support is provided to slow learners to overcome academic difficulties. They are given various practice assignments and also **extra classes/remedial classes** are conducted

wherein they can any time approach their faculty professors for any kind of difficulties

faced in their learning. The students who fails in any course undergo self-study courses which are well **guided by the faculty** or any of 1 **student is assigned** to help the student for overcoming their weakness, develop better understanding of the subject and clear their back paper.

English is offered as a bridge course for all the students of the faculty which helps them in keeping at par in terms of communication skills needed to make them survive in the industry.

Regular mentor and mentee meetings are held to review academic progress and counsel students if in case they are having any kind of difficulties in their attendance, personal issues, hostel issues or academics

They are trained to use audio visual aids like power point, charts and models for effective presentation. The teachers encourage them to participate in national level paper presentation contests, seminars and project exhibition competitions.
